

- More than a third (36%) like them all

- 10% "surveys that feel like quizzes"
- 9% "health topics"
- 7% "surveys about financial matters"

We now provide sample weights for our growing representative samples of California and Los Angeles County. Our list-targeted Native American and Los Angeles County family samples have zero base weight and zero final post-stratification weight
