Merged data from multiple UAS surveys, ready to download and analyze.

- subjective well-being

- retirement data
- financial management
- preparation for retirement
- knowledge of Social Security rules
- useful derived variables. (e.g. household total wealth, yearly earnings, self-reported health, etc.)

The UAS Comprehensive File merges the data from a number of core surveys in the UAS and includes useful and carefully derived variables from the UAS Health and Retirement Study (UAS HRS).

We will be adding more UAS HRS variables over time to the file, covering topics such as pensions, family structure and social security income.
