This document is the crosstab release. The poll's methodology statement, including full question text and topline data comparisons to previous survey results, is provided in the topline document –available at bit.ly/USCPolls.

Sample sizes and margin of sampling error: The survey was conducted among 5,862 adult U.S. residents who are members of the Center for Economic and Social Research's Understanding America Study probability-based online panel. Included are 5,680 eligible voters; 4,869 registered voters; and 2,227 Democratic voters deemed likely to vote in the 2020 primaries. Margin of sampling error is +/-2 for all of these samples at the 98% confidence level, and may be higher for subgroups. Sample size and margin of sampling error for banner subgroups are provided in this document.

Reading the tables: These crosstabs include weighted percentages, unweighted sample sizes, and margin of sampling error. It is important to note that our two-stage weights* account for both UAS sample design and post-stratification to Census benchmarks, so unweighted subgroup sample sizes provided in these tables may not be representative of the proportion the subgroup represents in the estimated result.

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This table indicates which candidate voters supported in last October's poll, broken out by the candidate they support now. So 36% of Bloomberg's voters in this poll supported Biden last October, and 21% of Bloomberg's current voters supported Warren. In general, two-thirds or fewer of the respondents in this poll who also participated in the October poll supported the same candidate in October that they back now.
